Code of Conduct

As an emerging industry it is important we establish and maintain a reputation we can be proud of, built on safe flying, professionalism and collaboration. All members of UAVNZ are required to sign the Code of Conduct (attached).

Costs

Annual costs of UAVNZ membership (year ended March 2016):

Member \$200 per annum + GST. Members are commercial UAV operators who have been certificated in accordance with Civil Aviation Rule Part 102.

Associate \$100 per annum + GST. Associate members are generally individuals, participants and stakeholders interested in growing commercial and economic outcomes from UAV technology (e.g. commercial Civil Aviation Rule Part 101 operators, training organisations, system suppliers, research and government organisations).

- 3) email a signed copy of the UAVNZ Code of Conduct to info@uav.org.nz
